Many happy blessings this Holyday season! Thanksgiving week, we traveled to Taura, El Salvador to witness 2 very special life passages for our youth. We want to share with all of you who partner with us to help these children. Several of our students graduated from 9<sup>th</sup> grade, the last year of middle school; we were there to encourage their commitment to education. Katy, who now goes by Abi, and her cousin Manfreddis were among the graduates. Instead of their school uniforms, the students really dress up, although even that is uniform also. All the girls wear the same dress, and the boys wear the same shirt and vest. 12 years ago, few Taura children could afford to go to school. Parents had not been to school, and families needed children at home to work. Now, education is valued and more families want children to go to school. We are presently trying to raise the funds to return 25 students to school for the 2017 school year that begins in January. Only half are sponsored. Please consider a donation of \$300 to sponsor a child's year of school.

Emanuel Youth Mission does many different projects to improve the standard of living for the impoverished people of rural villages in El Salvador, but what makes it special is that it is also *a relational mission*.
